Salisbury was the 5<sup>th</sup> largest city in North Carolina. A prison, designed to hold 2000 men, was built there. The first group of 119 Union prisoners occupied the site in December 1861, and rose to 1400 by May 1862. Plentiful water and shade from oak trees, made the prison feel agreeable. In the early part of the war, prisoners were well cared for and even indulged in baseball as was recorded by Otto Boetticher. His drawing at Salisbury Confederate Prison is one of the first drawings ever of a baseball game in America. By October 1864 the prison held 5000, and 10,000 soon after that. Later when the prison became overcrowded and the death rate rose from 2% to 28%, mass graves were used to accommodate the dead. Approximately 3,500 – 5,000 unknown Union soldiers were buried in 18 trenches, 240 feet long. By February 1865, 3700 had been transferred to Greensboro and another 1500 to Richmond. By the time of Gen. George Stoneman's cavalry raid in April, the prison was a supply depot. Stoneman burned down the prison in April 1865 and a wood fence was built around the trenches. After the war, the Office of the Quartermaster General established a National Cemetery here a monument to the unknown dead was erected.

**CDCWRT MEETING**

***The local Civil War soldier was Pvt. Charles W. Sheppard, who lived in Waterford. His story is told through a***

***series of letters. Sheppard enlisted in December 1863, fought in 7 major battles, and was captured on August 24, 1864. He eventually died on January 25, 1865 in Salisbury Prison, NC.***

**BOARD MEETING**

The February meeting was held on February 22, 2016. The treasurer reported \$1,246 in the regular account and over \$6,000 in the Preservation account.

There were 12 members who renewed their memberships and 3 new members joined. The CDCWRT will be participating in a number of events over the next several months. Volunteers are encouraged to talk to Matt George if you would like to help. Your attendance at these events is also encouraged, and more details will be announced in later newsletters.

The Civil War Trust has notified the CDCWRT that the round table is listed as a Brigade Level Color Bearer in the CWT. We have donated more than 100 times to preservation projects.

The website for the CDCWRT has been down for several weeks now, through no fault of the round table's webmaster. This has become unacceptable and the board is exploring a new location for our website. This has become a high priority for the board and hopefully we will have a new site within the month.

Finally, the board voted to donate \$1,000 to the CWT to preserve a crucial piece of land at Fredericksburg. This is a 24:1 match, so the donation will be leveraged to over \$24,000.

## UCALL SPRING COURSE AT UNION COLLEGE

Five lectures will be held at Union College as part of the spring program. All lectures are scheduled for Wednesday afternoons beginning at 12:30 pm.

**APRIL 6, 2016:** Matt Farina, MD will describe the medical advances that were made during the war and deal with some of the myths and truths of 19<sup>th</sup> Century medicine.

**April 13, 2016:** Union College Prof. Andrea Foroughi's talk will focus on the home front during the war where its direct consequences literally came home not only as battles were waged on their land, but also through guerrilla warfare, urban riots and frontier fighting.

April 20, 2016: Maxine Getty, retired Senior Master Sargent, US Air Force, will portray Mary A.R. Livermore, abolitionist, teacher, nurse and suffragette through her trials and tribulations during this turbulent time in our history.

**April 27, 2016:** Matt George, Civil War reenactor, will portray a private from the 134<sup>th</sup> New York regiment on detached duty to educate the public about his war experiences and the motivations that prompted him and others to join the fight.
